

Nodes of Transfer Success Initiative

Overview: Countless markers are available to track transfer success. Most aid in determining engagement and outcomes. IU, through the <u>University Transfer Office</u>, herein defines 10 nodes serving as pillars of transfer success. Campus leaders, with support from various units, are asked to track and report on the nodes annually for positive outcomes and growth. It is not our expectation for your campus to meet a 100% of the nodes. Most campuses, in year one may only meet 25-50%. This is our first year of assessment. Outcomes may be varied until we learn of your campus and community activities/projects.

Nodes of Transfer Success Markers

Results of the <u>2019 IU Transfer Survey</u>, where 5,000 IU transfer students were surveyed, rated IU as transfer friendly. Students reported positive experiences in admittance to program of choice, explanation of non-admittance, satisfaction with financial aid opportunities, new student orientation, access to advising, sports and athletics opportunities, access to campus support and services, overall class scheduling options, registration time frame, articulation decision, test score acceptance, and feeling accepted as a member of the IU community.

Survey results document experiences of students who stayed, after transfer, to IU. Experiences of those who left/never enrolled was not captured. The survey factors offer a proxy of need for continued improvements to remain transfer friendly.
