


## **CAUCUS MEMO**

IU campuses, via the University Transfer Office in the Office of the Executive Vice President for University Academic Affairs, are engaged in responding to IUs 21 transfer friendly standards in 2021. Your campus representative is actively reporting and responding to these standards alongside a stakeholder workgroup, UIRR, OOE, and USSS.



## What happened?

Meeting #4 - March 25, 2021

Weekly Theme	Co-Leads

Co-leads Donna Dahlgren, Michelle Malott, Sacha Thieme, and Mike Bem focused on three (9, 10, 11) of the six policies standards which ranked lower than the IU campus "met" response average of 88%.

**Standard 7:** Once accepted in transfer, a course from a regionally accredited institution is treated in the same way as the comparable course at the campus without regard to source.

- a. Current campus status: 100% met
- b. <u>Discussion items</u>: If intent of phrasing "treated in the same way" suggested a consistent process is administered by a department, then IUB has met this standard. After review of standard 9, IUB altered status to "met." Standard is now 100% met.

Standard 8: Once accepted in transfer, a course is treated in the same way as the comparable course at the campus without regard to modality.

a. <u>Current campus status:</u> 100% met

**Standard 9:** Once accepted in transfer, courses based on prior learning assessment (PLA) or demonstrated competency (CBE) are treated in the same way as the comparable courses at the campus.

- a. Current campus status: 66.7% met, 11.1% in-progress, 22.2% unmet
- b. <u>Goals:</u> a) Conduct review of current processes for PLA or CBE, b) Identify differences, c) Increase transparency and understanding of PLA and CBE processes. <u>General IU statement</u>
- c. <u>Discussion items</u>: Sharing historical data from prior transfer workgroups on topic to understand bottlenecks. A model is being created to address PLA contact UTO with questions. Best practice Labor Studies identified a self-acquired competency within program.

**Standard 10:** Courses accepted for undistributed credit receive full consideration within degree programs. Wherever possible, faculty and departments work in advance with students to determine applicability of undistributed credit to degree.

- a. <u>Current campus status:</u> **66.7**% met, **11.1**% in-progress, **22.2**% unmet
- b. <u>Goals:</u> a) Create guiding principles to support consistency of expectations creating campus-level processes until then, b) Establish review schedule for common UNDI courses, c) Identify and leverage articulation tools/workflow, & d) Identify tools to report trends.
- c. Discussion items: Increase faculty awareness of available training documents and items in Canvas. Increase departmental awareness through regular updates. Referenced ACA-55 not just for intercampus transfers, but for all new transfers.

Standard 11: Movement of credit among IU campuses should be equivalent, per the policies of IU.

- a. Current campus status: 77.8% met, 11.1% in-progress, 11.1% unmet
- b. <u>Goals:</u> a) Foster faculty discussion on topic, b) Identify and leverage articulation tools/workflow, c) Seek opportunities for more reliable and transparency messaging around inter-campus transfer.
- c. <u>Discussion items</u>: No emerging technology that addresses workflow for articulation rules. Need to be more consistent in updating the MCI (<u>ACA81</u>) (in SiS) to permit immediate access to campus course equivalencies build into existing trainings. Best practice Collaborative BS Informatics Canvas page with shared training and resources.
- d. Next steps:

**Standard 13:** The campus and university assure that IU academic standards and integrity in transfer and articulation are maintained.

- a. Current campus status: **88.9%** met, **11.1%** in-progress
- b. Discussion items: IUK in-progress.

Action item: Post examples of campus process and the application of policies in Teams.
