Credit Transfer Service (CTS) Updates

IU's official site for <u>credit transfer</u> is the CTS. At the end of 2017, under the leadership of UTO, a taskforce reviewed transfer credit needs at IU, explored systems and products, and defined expectations for the CTS. Outcomes indicated a need to enhance ease of use, improve effectiveness and efficiency, and give attention to needs of prospective students. A phase two of this work is being led by USSS. A phased implementation is expected beginning with the convening of a technical work group. The workgroup will identify specific development objectives, deliverables, and timelines. Articulation Agreement Repository

Across the world, IU is an exceptional partner in higher education. This is evidenced by the varied programs, students, and agreements. With a goal of increasing transfer transparency and building a public facing portal for prospective transfer students, UTO launched a new initiative. In partnership with campus and admission leaders UTO is collecting any and all articulation agreements (*internal and external*) regardless of source or year. The objective is 3-fold: 1) review and update; 2) display partnership (for transparency in credit transfer to-and-from partner institution); and 3) conduct data assessment and archive.
