### Dear Transfer Staff,

Happy New Year! UTO is looking forward to all the great things that will come with 2019. We are excited to work on new priorities and new projects this year.

One of UTO's 2019 priorities is to put an emphasis on becoming transfer student friendly university-wide. UTO is using <u>ACCRAO's</u> Transfer Student Bill of Rights as a premise in order to understand what it means to be a transfer student friendly institution, and to evaluate transfer student friendliness at each IU campus. UTO hopes to better assess transfer student friendliness and highlight areas of focus at each campus by using a student survey. This survey will be circulated to all campuses in March.

The Transfer Training Canvas Staff and Faculty Courses are now live. Please refer to the links on the right to access these courses. These links can be forwarded to any transfer faculty/staff member who works on evaluating transfer courses or creating equivalences. The UTO is also finalizing the Transfer Training Administrator course. It will be completed in February.

The UTO website is undergoing final edits and will be ready to access in early February.

An intercampus milestone visibility error has been found and is being investigated to find possible solutions to fix it.

The IU Transfer Symposium is on February 22, 2019 at the IUPUI Campus Center, from 7:30 a.m.-1 p.m., Eastern Time.
